

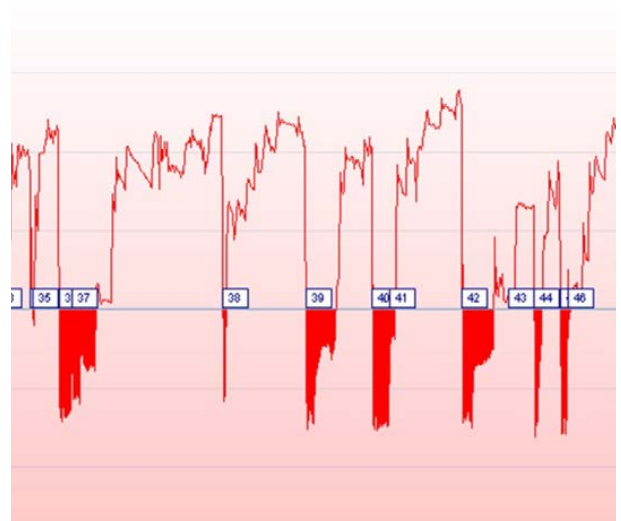
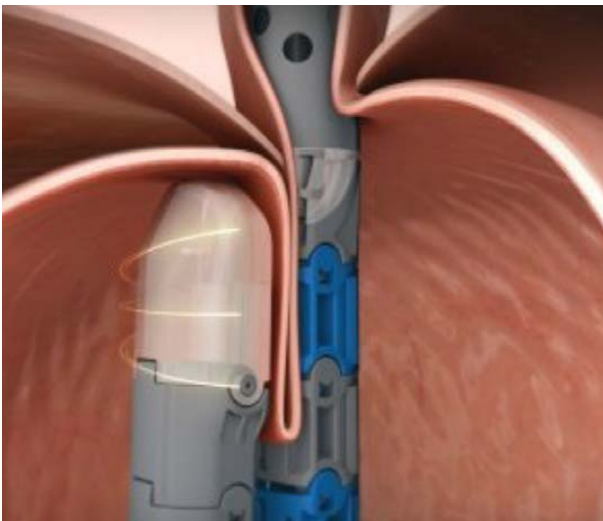
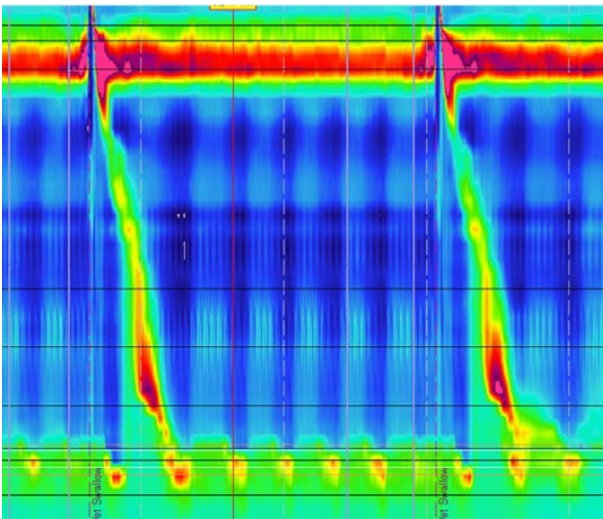

There is a didactic session and hands on experience for endoscopic eradication therapy for Barrett's esophagus and early esophageal cancer with interesting cases, a question and answer session and hands on practice.
